At a time when the global community is looking for scalable and "down-to-earth" approaches for recovery from the coronavirus disease, it is of critical importance to pay due attention to showcase the contribution of Eco-Inclusive SME-Innovations in the context of the green recovery and SDG agenda.

The event will serve as a critical multi-stakeholder platform to exchange with high-level representatives from governments, international organisations and private sector on how scalable private sector innovations can contribute to the SDGs and the triple transformation needed. It will identify synergies between different public-private stakeholder interventions and will support the understanding that a systemic integrated approaches is critical for the achievement of the SDGs. The side-events circular, nature-positive and agrifood SME innovations will demonstrate how a contribution to the HLPF 2023 focal SDGs can be scaled-up supported by the side-events partners.
