A community-led approach to water-efficient crop irrigation and bio-fuel production in semi-arid regions

Pintadas Solar has won one of five **2008 SEED Awards** for its work to help small farmers communities to adapt to climate change, improve local food security, mitigate their own carbon emissions, and reduce poverty by increasing income and creating local employment opportunities.

Partners in *Pintadas Solar* are developing a community-led approach to disseminate small-scale irrigation technologies in the semi-arid Northeast of Brazil. This region is characterized by little precipitation, hot temperatures, sandy soils and prolonged periods of droughts, which are increasing due to climate change.



Scaling up impacts

As part of the Award, SEED is supporting *Pintadas Solar* in its efforts to grow. Starting from the experience gained during the implementation of 7 pilot irrigation projects, the partners are looking for organizations that will help with refining the technological platform and the approach to launch a regional small-scale irrigation programme that could be replicated in parts of the world which are facing similar challenges.

Planned activities include:

- Working with communities to create a fully integrated package of technology that includes adequate water pumping and irrigation technologies, fertilizers, technical assistance and capacity building to increase crop production
- Developing a replicable micro-finance model to support farmers access the technological package above
- **Commercializing food products** in local, regional and specialty (i.e. organic, fair trade) markets
- Creating agro-energy farmer cooperatives to develop small-scale bio-fuel systems (vegetable oil and hydrous ethanol).

How you could help

To ensure the long-term future of this innovative, locallyled partnership for sustainable development, additional contacts, financing opportunities and communication and marketing networks are important. In particular, the following support is needed:

- Contacts with relevant national and international commercial organisations and/or research institutions with an interest in developing and rolling out an appropriate technological package.
- Expert support to develop the replicable microfinance model.
- **Expert support** for a hydraulic and agricultural characterization of the region.
- Funding partners to support the regional scale-up of the project.
