





SAG-SEED WINNER 2016 **S**

Green Road Ltd is piloting the construction of polymerised bitumen roads from recycled plastic and asphalt. They provide marginalised groups with employment in plastic collection and reduce the amount of plastic waste that would have otherwise ended up in landfills or be incinerated.

BUSINESS MODEL

Green Road Ltd is piloting the construction of eco-friendly, durable roads from a material comprised of asphalt and recycled plastic (polymerized bitumen). The material increases the longevity of roads, reducing waterlogging and potholes which are common problems for ordinary bitumen roads.

The company sources plastics that are collected by women and youth groups around urban dump sites and streets. The enterprise's target market includes national and county governments, the Kenya National Highways Authority (KENHA) and road contractors.

Social impacts:

- Alleviating poverty by directly employing staff and indirectly involving marginalised youth and women in plastic waste collection and supply.
- Improving living standards of waste collectors through increasing income and providing health insurance.

Environmental impacts:

- Recycling 1 million kg of plastics within the upcoming year, thereby preventing 2.5 million kg of CO₂ emissions.
- Reducing the amount of plastics that would have otherwise be burned (a common waste disposal method).

Economic impacts:

- Strengthening the local recycling industry by creating a market for plastic waste in the cities.
- Providing vulnerable groups with formal employment.
- Reducing cost of using bitumen in road construction by 10 % and reducing the costs of road maintenance by 6 %.

Kericho county produces 500 tons of plastic on daily basis; if polymerised bitumen roads are adopted, a minimum of 40,000 tons of plastic would be used to make roads.

Scaling up activities:

- Acquire better equipment to increase production capacity.
- Expand the collection of plastic beyond Kericho town to other neighbouring towns.
- Collect and recycle 1 million kg of plastics in the coming year.
- Create 25 direct jobs in the recycling plant and 500 indirect jobs for marginalised youth and women in the collection of plastics.







Partnership

- O Green Road Ltd manages all operations and offers financial support and strategic leadership for the enterprise.
- Kericho County provides contracts for Green Road Limited Ltd to build roads at regional and national levels.
- **Daniph Eco-World,** a social enterprise, is the main supplier sub-contracted by Green Road to obtain the plastic material. It uses a collection network of mainly youth and women groups for a constant supply of plastic.
- O Blossom Agencies, comprised mainly of women involved in waste plastic collection in (Ainamoi) Kericho, will also supply plastic raw materials.
- Kenya Industrial Research & Development Institute (KIRDI) provides technical training and support to Green Road Ltd.


